Overview

University City includes Drexel University, Saint Josephs University and Penn. University City is unique in that it's largest residents are stakeholders of the University's in the area. Take the time to explore the businesses and activities in the area!

Penn Museum 3260 South Street

The University of Pennsylvania Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology maintains a collection of nearly a million historical objects. Penn Students can also take anthropology and archeology classes in here and have free access to the museum.

Penn Park & 2 Schuylkill River Trail

Penn Park is a 24-acre park on the campus of the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The park is at South 31st Street and Walnut Street, and features two athletic fields, a multipurpose stadium with 470 seats, a tennis center, a seasonal air structure, and picnic areas. Right across the river trail, there is the schuvlkill river trail that you can walk or bike down.

Cira Green 3 129 S 30th Street

Cira Green is an urban green space featuring grassy spots, skyline vistas, a burger joint & outdoor activities. They have Sunset Socials every week, and also project movies on a big screen so that everyone in the park can watch it for free.

30th Street Station & The Porch

30th Street Station, officially William H. Grav III 30th Street Station, is a major intermodal transit station in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. It is metropolitan Philadelphia's main railroad station and a major stop on Amtrak's Northeast and Keystone corridors The Porch is the Venue outside and hosts events throughout the year.

The Board & Brew

33rd & Chestnut. 3200 Chestnut St

This restaurant that specializes in all sorts of board games. They have a pretty large menu and a huge selection of games to choose from to play while you eat/wait for your food.

Leonard Pearlstein Gallery 34th & Filbert Street

This is Drexel's contemporary art gallery that is free to the public and has changing exhibitions throughout the year. This Museum also works through community partnerships to bring in emerging artists' Work and is completely free to the public.



Quorum 3675 Market Street

Plug into Ouorum three different ways: through a free 3,000 square foot lounge serving as an open workspace or informal meeting location; with signature programming designed to connect innovators with the resources and people needed to grow their business or

pursue an idea; or by renting meeting or event space in our 11,000 square foot facility.

Penn Institute of Contemporary Art 118 S 36th Street

This institute is a contemporaty art museum that is noncollecting but instead changes exhibitions showing emerging artwork of the time. It is free for the public to view and see. There are also times where some student exhibitions are held here as well as Penn events.

Between 31st & 32nd and Baring St & Powelton Ave

A former industrial site turned community park that opened in 2008. It is 2.5 acres and has 45 trees.



Walnut Street Cafe 2929 Walnut Street

Philadelphia Flea Markets
