STADIUM DISTRICT AND SOUTHEAST ASIAN MARKET

Overview:

This tour showcases Philadelphia's stadium district, home to professional athletic events, concerts, and games. It ends at the Southeast Asian market in FDR Park, a cultural landmark where students can explore and enjoy the food and atmosphere before returning to campus.

Transportation:

To get to the Stadium District: Take Market Frankford Line to City Hall. Then go to the connection to the Broad Street Line and take it South to the NRG stop at the end of the line.

1 Citizens Bank Park 1 Citizens Bank Way

Citizen's Bank Park is home to the Philadelphia Phillies, the city's Major League Baseball team. This is also home to the beloved mascot, the Phillie Phanatic, who you may have seen at move-in. Come here to enjoy a baseball game, occasional concerts and events. They also host college nights where college students can get a free merchandise item like a shirt or blanket.

2 Lincoln Financial Field 1 Lincoln Financial Field Way

Lincoln Financial Field or known as "the Linc" is home to the NFL Team, the Philadelphia Eagles. It also serves as the home stadium for the Temple University football team. Philadelphia is known for their celebrations after wins by the Philadelphia Eagles where residents will go into the streets to celebrate.

3 Xfinity! Live Center 1100 Pattison Avenue

While in the stadium district, sports and non-sports fan alike all go to the Xfinity Live! Center. It is a restaurant and entertainment center with game showings, occasional concerts, movie screenings and more.

4 Wells Fargo Center 3601 South Broad Street

Wells Fargo Center is an indoor arena that hosts several of the Philadelphia Professional Leagues including the 76ers (the National Basketball Association), the Philadelphia Flyers (National Hockey League), and the Philadelphia Wings (National Lacrosse League). This center also hosts concerts throughout the year and will typically host some of games for the NCAA Division Basketball Tournament, March Madness.

5 FDR Park 1800 Pattison Avenue

Franklin Delano Roosevelt or FDR Park has around 348 acres of land and is located along the Delaware River. It has several recreational sport fields, walking trails, a lake, and picnic areas. It also hosts some major outdoor events such as occasionally hosting the Philadelphia Flower Show.

6 Southeast Asian Market Picnic Area #11 across from Taney Baseball Field & Lake Meadow

Located in FDR Park, the Southeast Asian Market is one of Philadelphia's greatest cultural landmarks. Occurring seasonally from April-November, the Southeast Asian market is home to Thai, Cambodian, Lao, Vietnamese & other Southeast Asian food vendors! It's open on the weekends from 10AM-6PM.

A The Navy Yard 4747 S Broad St #120

The Navy Yard is the nation's most successful military facility redevelopment, now a thriving community for companies and employees. Future growth plans include up to 10 million square feet of commercial and residential development. The yard features a navy yard, walking track, central track, waterfront walk, battleships, and Urban Outfitters.

B Pop's Homemade Italian Ice 1337 W Oregon Ave

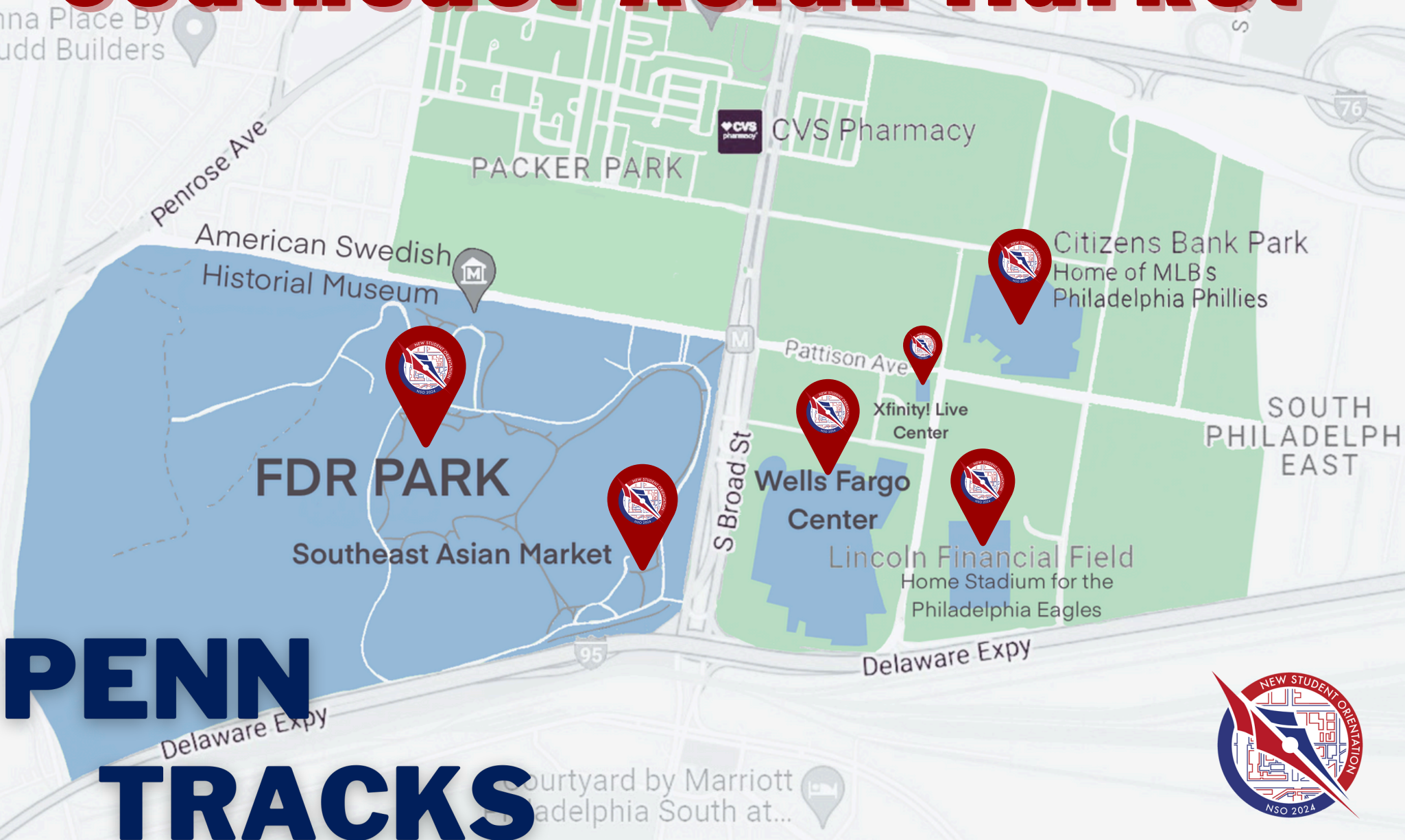
