Overview

This is a 45-minute exploration of key cultural, historical, and community sites around the University of Pennsylvania. Highlights include The ARCH, Netter Center, significant murals, and local spots like ACME Markets and Cinemark, showcasing the area's rich history and resources.

The Arts Research & Culture House 1 (The ARCH) 3601 Locust Walk

The ARCH is a vibrant hub at Penn for cultural engagement, housing La Casa Latina, Makuu: The Black Cultural Center, and the Pan-Asian American Community House (PAACH). It fosters an inclusive environment with support and spaces that celebrate diverse identities.



Hamilton Village

High Rise Field is a green space between the high-rise College Houses on Penn's western campus. It offers a place for activities like frisbee, picnics, and outdoor events, fostering campus community.

Founded in 1992, the Barbara and Edward Netter Center for Community Partnerships is Penn's main initiative for advancing civic and community engagement.

The Tuskegee Airmen (mural) 20 N 39th St

Marcus Akinlana's mural, completed on July 31, 2008, honors the first African-American airmen under Benjamin O. Davis Jr., depicting their journey from childhood flying dreams to uniformed pilots.

The Silent Watcher (mural) 5 3911 Market Street

Faith XLVII's mural, completed on September 24, 2019, celebrates West Philadelphia's community spirit.

The Legacy of Bishop Richard 6 Allen and the A.M.E Church (mural) African Methodist Episcopal Church

Willis Humphrey's mural, created on July 4, 2016, celebrates Richard Allen, a former slave who founded the African Methodist Episcopal Church.

Soul of the Black Bottom (mural) 7 4047 Market St

eL Seed's mural, completed on November 18, 2017, uses "calligraffiti" to highlight the Black Bottom community's displacement due to university expansion, featuring Arabic script and a W.E.B. Du Bois quote.
